
DIRECTOR BIOGRAPHY: NICOLAS HOUVER




DIRECTOR BIOGRAPHY: ADITI SRIDHAR










MY LIFE IN SIX PIECES

Since, he has directed about ten independent short films, including Silence is deadly (2018), about the hunt for homosexuals in Chechnya, twenty festival selections and 8 prizes around the word; and The Runaway (La Fugue - 2016), awareness short film produced voluntarily for the French Child Protection Center, broadcast on french TV channels.

Currently, Brice has just finished his first produced film, After the storm (Après l'orage), a eighty minutes short film about a conflicting father-son relationship and the emancipation of a teenager. The screenplay was finalist for the Scenario Label of the Maison du Film in 2017.
